All the Light We Cannot See by Anthony Doerr

Historical fiction, set During World War II, tells of two teenagers, one a blind girl in Nazi-occupied France and a German orphan boy pressed into service by the Nazi army, and how they come together as they unknowingly save each other's lives. Marie-Laure goes blind when she is six years and lives with her father in Paris. Her father works at the Museum of Natural History where Marie-Laure spends as much time there as her father. Completely doted by her father, he builds a miniature neighborhood so Marie-Laure can memorize by touch and navigates her way through the neighborhood. When the Nazis occupy Paris, they flee to the walled citadel of Saint-Malo and Marie-Laure is thrown into a life almost as dark as her blindness. Werner grows up with sister in an orphanage in a small mining town in Germany. He loves to tinker with electronics and finds and fix an old radio. His ability to fix and enhance radios and instruments of communications comes to the attention of Hitler Youth Academy where he is enlisted with basically no choice. Werner travels through the heart of the war and finally into Saint-Malo where the once teenager's stories converge. This historical fiction novel is available in the library's adult fiction collection (Call Number F Doerr).
