The Dark Day's Club by Allison Goodman

This trilogy series was so well researched to be a Regency fantasy, from clothes to magazines to the science of the era. Lady Helen's world is all about maintaining reputation and trying to be an exemplary young lady after the stain of her parents' reputation, particularly her mother, that has made her aunt and uncle worry about Helen's future. They aren't allowed to discuss with their parents. She knows very little other than what she and her brother, Andrew, remember. So, imagine Helen's surprise when, at her presentation to court with the other young ladies, Queen Charlotte leans down and whispers that Helen shouldn't believe everything she hears about her parents. This just scratches the surface of what will be revealed to Helen. Her world of dances, poetry, and promenade suddenly become a shade darker when it is revealed there is another layer beneath the surface of the world that she knows. Things deadly and sinister walk among the upper class and demimonde. This book is a combination of sinister Lovecraftian themes and regency romance.
